He introduces family members, gives a tour of his home, and describes the barn which was setting for much youthful mischief. Next, stories of Hatherly School, its teachers, and its activities, are related in vivid detail. Don entertains with accounts of construction efforts: a train, playhouse, pirate ship, underground hideout, tree houses, a boat, and two chicken coops. He acquaints us with several neighborhood characters: Jere Ainslie, whose small store featured genuine penny candy; Lonnie Pratt, hardware clerk at Seavern's Store; Hymie Cohen, the ragman; Eloise Curtis, bakeshop entrepreneur; Louis Haartz, hopeful builder of the sloop Rainy Day; Pa Swift, builder of \$66.00 backyard swimming pool; and a host of playmates and teenage buddies. World War II is recounted in terms of scrap drives; food, gasoline, and shoe rationing; coastal defense; volunteer airplane spotters; emergency training; and air raid drills.
